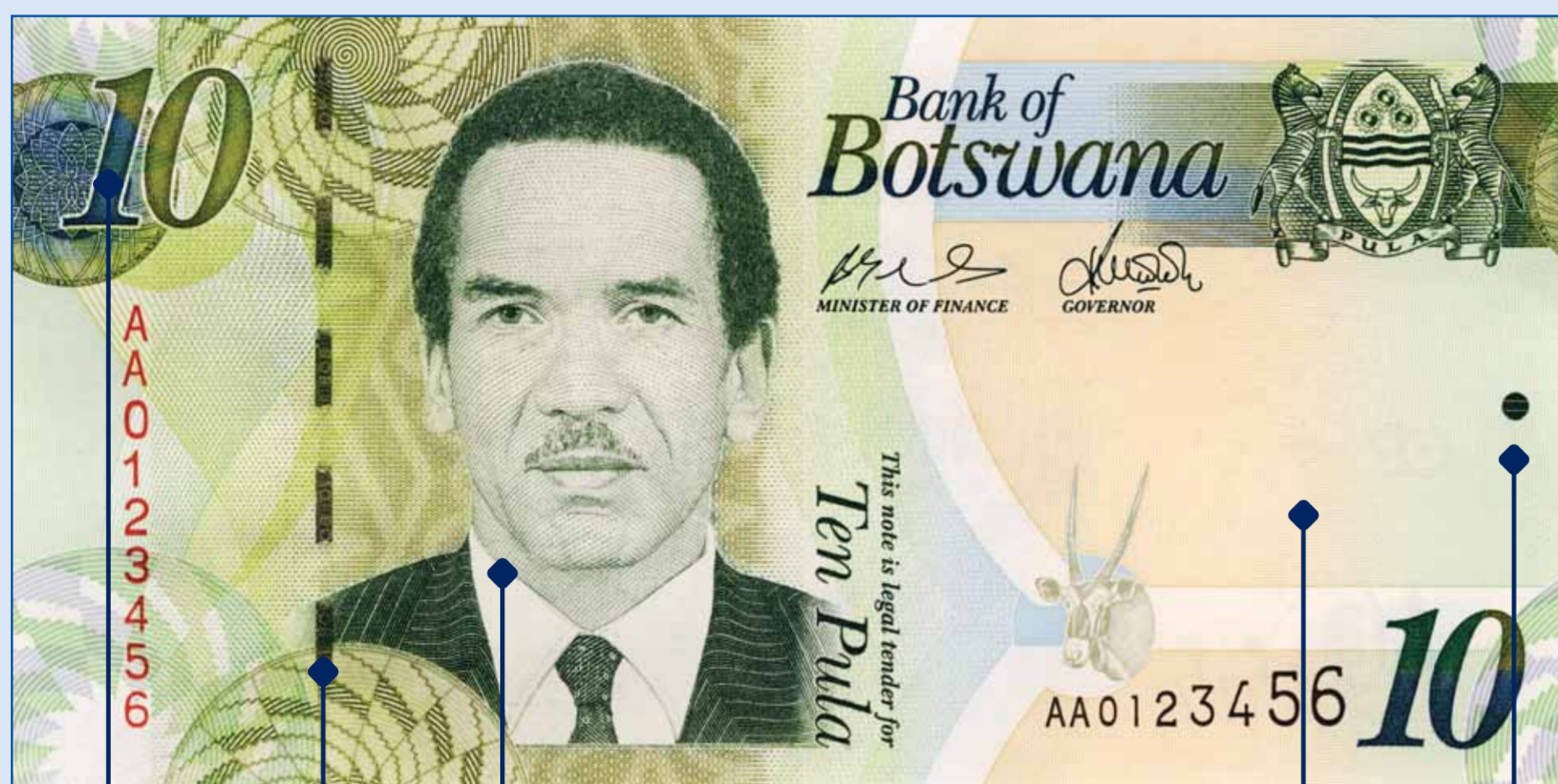

5 Windowed Security Thread

The silver coloured thread comes to the surface of the front of the banknote at regular intervals and the text "BOB 10" can be read. The thread can be seen as a continuous line when held up to the light. The thread on the P10 banknote is not as wide as the thread on the P20, P50, P100 and P200 banknotes.

6 Blind Recognition Feature

One green dot appears on the front right hand edge of the banknote.

7 Micro Lettering

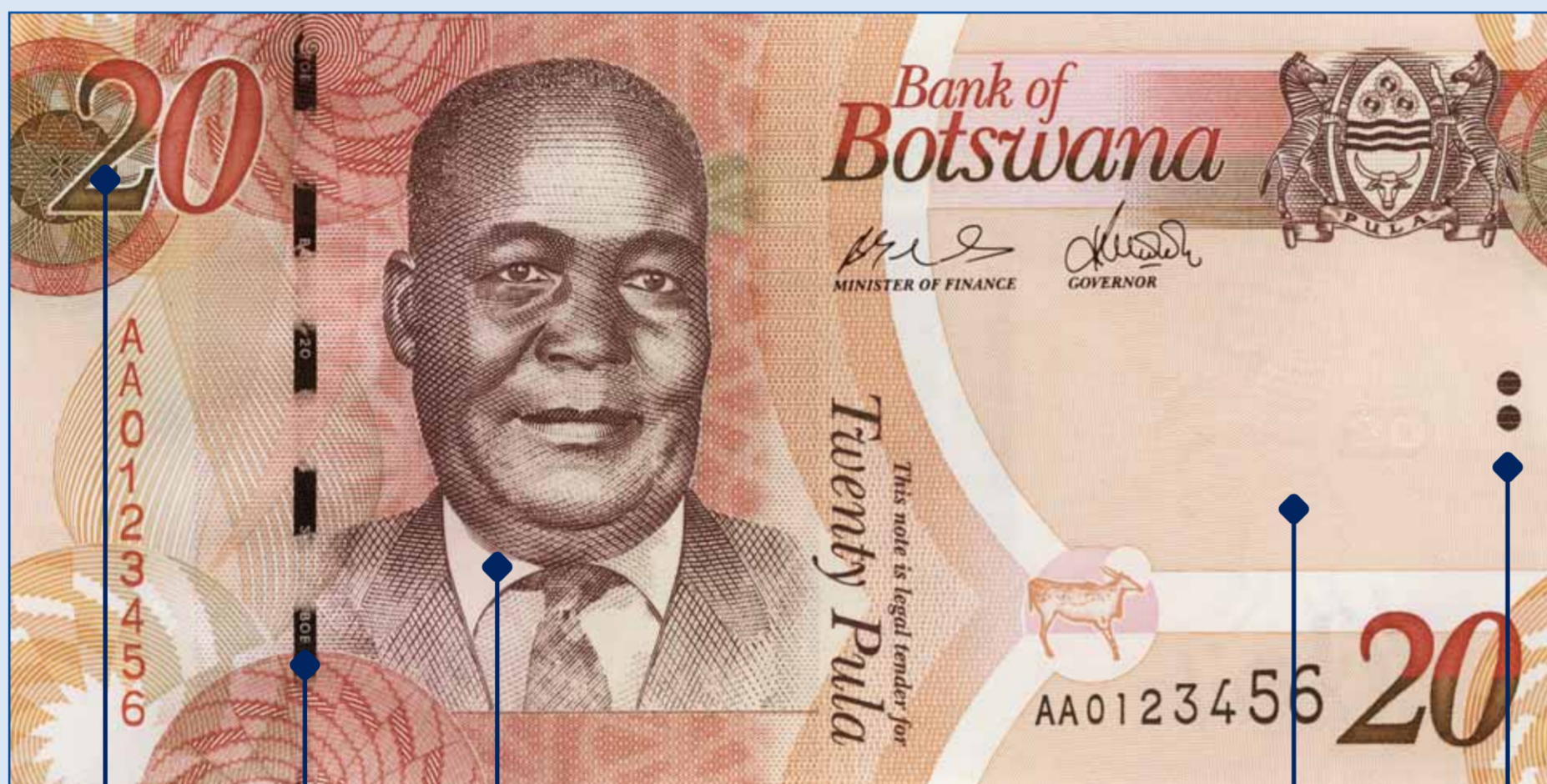
The letters 'BOB' can be read under very strong magnification.

The letters 'BOB' can be read under very strong magnification.
